



# PEAK 2 PEAK 360 SIGHTSEE EXPERIENCE (BOOKING REQUIRED)

Ride three of Whistler Blackcomb's Gondolas including the record-breaking PEAK 2 PEAK Gondola providing an unparalleled perspective of British Columbia's rooftop and incomparable views of towering volcanic peaks, coastal rainforests, and ancient glaciers.

Start by venturing to the top of Whistler Mountain via a ride on the Whistler Gondola, a 5-minute walk from the Whistler Conference Centre. Take in the views from the Roundhouse lodge and visit the Family & Friends dedicated space in Pikas restaurant for a warm beverage and snack. Then travel the PEAK 2 PEAK Gondola over to Blackcomb Mountain. When ready, make your way back to the Village via the Blackcomb Gondola.

Self-transport recommended / Accessible Shuttle available

Accessible Route: Whistler Village Gondola up to the top of Whistler Mountain, PEAK 2 PEAK Gondola round trip, Whistler Village Gondola down to the base of Whistler Mountain.

# BUBLY™ TUBE PARK (BOOKING REQUIRED)

Take an exhilarating ride down Whistler Blackcomb's tubing hill. Located on Blackcomb Mountain, the Bubly™ Tube Park offers great fun for the young and the young at heart. No skill or equipment required - just a sense of adventure and a desire for excitement. It's the perfect family activity!

Children must be at least 3 years of age and a minimum height of 36in / 91cm tall. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult in the Tube Park, however kids under 12 can still ride by themselves as long as they are tall enough.

**Accessible Note**: This is not an accessible experience. There are several stairs and long stretches of snow in the venue.






# WHISTLER INVICTUS VILLAGE

The voucher alone is not valid for list access, and you must pay for a valid lift ticket to be on the mountain. Whistler Blackcomb is apart of the Epic Pass Ski Pass Program. Please confirm if you have access to Whistler Blackcomb on your pass before arrival if you are planning to use your existing ski /ride season pass.

#### **Audain Art Museum**

Activity Duration: 2 hours Accessible & Sensory Friendly

The 56,000 square foot Museum, located in Whistler, British Columbia, was designed by the award-winning architectural firm Patkau Architects. Set in a grove of spruce trees, the architecture is intentionally restrained in its visual presence to fit within the natural environment.

The Museum's Permanent Collection showcases the Art of British Columbia from the late 18th century to present. Anchoring the collection is James Hart's The Scream Too, the most significant contemporary carved cedar Dance Screen in the world. Highlights include James Hart's The Scream Too and an important collection of 19th and 20th century First Nations masks and works by some of Canada's most celebrated artists including Emily Carr, E.J. Hughes and the internationally renowned photo-conceptualists Jeff Wall, Stan Douglas and others.

In addition to the Permanent Collection the Museum has visiting exhibitions of art from Canada and around the world.

#### Whistler Museum

Activity Duration: 1 hour

Visit the Whistler Museum to learn about Whistler's history from wilderness to world-class resort. The Museum tells Whistler's stories from early fun-loving summer lodge operators, to the creation of Whistler Blackcomb, to the 2010 Winter Olympic & Paralympic Games and beyond. Located behind the Whistler Public Library, in the heart of Whistler Village. (Note: The Museum may be in a NEW building/space in Feb 2025!)

#### **Nordic Skiing**

Activity Duration: 2 hours Sensory Friendly

Follow a cross-country ski trail looping around the frosted rim of Whistler's Lost Lake Park featuring more than 30 kilometres of cross-country skiing trails with incredible views of Whistler and Blackcomb Mountains. Enjoy a circuit on the groomed trails, night skiing or a lesson to improve your skills. Snowshoeing is also available at the park, which is just a short walk from Whistler Village.

#### **Snowshoeing**

Activity Duration: 2 hours Sensory Friendly

The easiest way to experience Whistler's natural winter wonderland– if you can walk, you can snowshoe! Follow trails deep into the forest to see snow-covered old growth trees and spot birds and other wildlife. A fun activity for all ages and abilities – simply bring warm clothing and a sense of adventure. Rent modern snowshoes and explore by yourself or take a guided tour.
